Dear Mr. Johnson:

Thank you for your correspondence describing the above referenced project. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act requires federal agencies, or their designated representatives, to take into account the effects of their undertakings on historic properties. Federal agencies, or their designated representatives, must request the comments of this office when they are considering an action, or if they are assisting, permitting, or licensing an action that may affect archeological sites or historic buildings built prior to 1956.

The review staff, led by John W. Murphey, concurs that the following are **ELIGIBLE** for the National Register of Historic Places under the contexts identified in *Historic Resources Survey, Naval Weapons Industrial Reserve Plant, Dallas, Dallas County, Texas*:

- Facility 1, Plant "A": 1941 production plant, Criterion A
- Facility 6, Plant "B": 1943 production plant, Criterion A
- Facility 16, Plant "B": 1943 hangar, Criterion A

The remaining surveyed properties are **NOT ELIGIBLE** for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. No further review of these undertakings as they affect *these* properties is required.

Please contact Linda Roark, Division of Architecture, at (512) 463-9122, for a determination of effect for those properties that were determined eligible. She may request architectural drawings, specifications, work write-ups, and a complete set of photographs showing all the areas that the proposed work may affect.


There are several properties that are significant for their association with the Regulus I and II guided missile programs developed by Vought for the Navy during the Cold War period (Facility

94, Facility 95, and Facility 97). Although not yet at the 50-year mark, grouped together these properties have potential NRHP eligibility as a historic district.

We look forward to further consultation with your office and hope to maintain a partnership that will foster effective historic preservation.
